Organizational Setting

The Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (RAP) is responsible for leading FAO's response to regional priorities for food security, agriculture and rural development through the identification, planning and implementation of FAO's priority activities in the region. It ensures a multidisciplinary approach to programmes, identifies priority areas of action for the Organization in the region and, in collaboration with the Regional Programme Leader (RPL), departments and divisions at headquarters, develops, promotes and oversees FAO's strategic response to regional priorities. RAP also advises on the incorporation of regional priorities into the Organization's Programme of Work and Budget and implements approved programmes and projects in the region, monitors the level of programme implementation and draws attention to problems and deficiencies. RAP develops and maintains relations with region-wide institutions including the Regional Economic Integration Organizations (REIOs). The Regional Office supports regional policy dialogue on food security, agriculture and rural development issues, facilitates the emergence of regional partnerships, and supports capacity development and resource mobilization for food security, agriculture and rural development in the region.

Reporting Lines

The Regional Epidemiology Coordinator reports to the Regional Manager of ECTAD in FAORAP.

Efficient surveillance and response performed by member countries which can be utilized by relevant regional stakeholders for prevention, control and eradication of transboundary animal diseases (TADs) and zoonotic emerging infectious diseases (EIDs).

- Participates in multidisciplinary teams, and/or leads working groups/teams collaborates with other departments and agencies on work groups and committees and promotes best practices;
- Collaborates in, provides technical backstopping to and ensures the quality/effectiveness of capacity development
 activities within member countries such as policy support, organizational development and individual learning
 events including preparation of related information, learning materials, on-line tools;
- Promotes knowledge sharing and best practices at international meetings and conferences and influences partners in stakeholder consultations;
- Performs other duties as required.

- For ASEAN and their Member States to implement the ASEAN Strategic Framework for Veterinary Epidemiology Capacity Development and Networking;
- For SAARC and their Member States to develop a Strategic Framework for veterinary epidemiology capacity development and networking;
- For East Asia CVO Forum on Transboundary Animal Diseases Control ' to develop a Strategic Framework for veterinary epidemiology capacity development and networking;
- Coordinates the development of the Epidemiology Mapping Tool (EMT), and supports its piloting and application
 thereof at country level to assess veterinary epidemiology capacity, to identify needs and gaps, and to guide policy
 and strategy to support sustainable veterinary epidemiology capacity development;
- Develops and coordinates the implementation of the regional programmes and activities to strengthen
 epidemiology capacity of member countries in the region and networking at national and regional levels;
- Coordinates with the ECTAD Country Teams to support the national epidemiology capacity building programmes and ensure active participation of the national veterinary epidemiology units to the regional veterinary epidemiology capacity building programmes;
- Coordinates and establishes linkages with designated OIE/FAO Reference/Collaborating Centres on Veterinary Epidemiology to ensure knowledge, technology and trouble-shooting support is made available to the member countries;
- In collaboration and coordination with other ECTAD teams at the regional and country levels, contributes to the
 design, provides technical support and guidance to the implementation of biosurveillance programmes including
 assessment of surveillance capacity; harmonizes data collection and information sharing process and provides
 assistance in strengthening these capacities as well as and operationalization of linkages between field
 epidemiology and laboratory diagnosis, and across animal health and human health sectors under the One Health
 approach;
- Contributes to preparation of country briefs, technical brochures, advocacy materials, progress and final reports and others as appropriate;

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in Veterinary Medicine or equivalent with a postgraduate emphasis on veterinary epidemiology;
- Five years of relevant experience with field epidemiology applications for animal as well as zoonotic diseases control, national and regional approaches to animal disease control;
- Working knowledge of English and limited knowledge of one of the other language (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian or Spanish).

- Experience in animal disease control in Asia with regional organizations like ASEAN, SAARC and other relevant bodies;
- Proficient technical report preparation skills;
- Extent and relevance of experience in liaison with partners and institutional contexts;
- Familiarity with UN or other international agencies field programmes is an asset;
