Through its Country Offices, or FAO Representations, FAO assists governments to develop policies, programmes and projects to address hunger and malnutrition, and provides technical support for the sustainable development of their agricultural, fisheries and forestry sectors. The activities of the FAO Country Offices include design and implementation of country-tailored field programmes, liaison with local donor representatives, and active public awareness-raising and outreach activities related to FAO initiatives such as the World Food Day.

Key Functions

- Provides technical leadership assistance on the development, implementation and evaluation of assigned programmes/projects; assists in the review of relevant documents and reports; identifies priorities, liaises with relevant parties; identifies follow-up actions;
- Assists in the coordination of programmes and reviews assessments of issues and trends for the implementation
 of programmes and projects and the preparation of impact evaluation or equivalent studies;
- Assists/supervises preparation of various written outputs, e.g. background papers, analysis, substantial sections
 of reports and studies, inputs to publications;
- Contributes to consultative and other meetings, conferences, to include proposing agenda topics, identifying participants, preparation of documents and presentations;
- Participates in activities; structures training workshops, seminars, makes presentations on assigned topics/activities;
- Leads field missions, including provision of guidance to external consultants, government officials and other parties;
- Provides advice to Chief Technical Adviser to develop policies and strategies as well as national protocols and guidelines for projects with specific domains related to FAO's work.

Specific Functions

- plans, manages and leads highly specialized or multidisciplinary teams; coordinates, and provides technical leadership on mariculture and its linkages with other sectors;
- analyses project's specific requirements and relevant technical issues to provide critical input and administrative guidance for its implementation and the execution of government policies in relation to the project;
- reviews implementation details, programmes and budgets in collaboration with FAO technical support staff;
- ensures that the hatchery is operated professionally and meets the set production targets to produce seed of milkfish, mud crab and sea cucumber to support aquaculture development in Zanzibar;
- reviews implementation, programme and budget with FAO technical support staff;

- prepares project progress reports to review and monitors the outputs and results of the project against agreed work plan, and to identify constraints and issues that require timely resolution and corrective actions;
- implements and monitors programmes of work involving the development of the approach and preparation of expenditure plan;
- identifies and implements strategic partnerships, advocates best practices and increased policy dialogue, develops and negotiates effective working relationships/consensus and agreements with international and national stakeholders;
- provides progress reports to the Board and KOICA on the operation of the marine hatchery;
- plans and oversees the provision of all FAO inputs, including organizing and assisting in purchase of equipment and supplies, and arranging for their maintenance;
- collaborates with Ministry of Agriculture, Natural Resources, Livestock and Fisheries (MANRLF), State University
 of Zanzibar and Institute of Marine Science (IMS) to develop training and research and development (R&D)
 programmes to support seed production and grow-out trials;
- manages the operation of the marine hatchery, its staff, technical and financial operations;
- liaises with other hatchery specialists in the country, region and globally to optimize the hatchery's operation;
- provides adequate close support to national consultants and to model farmers in grow-out demonstrations (in model farms and on the hatchery site in demo pond);
- supervises and supports the feasibility studies, and the commercialization and private sector liaison of the hatchery;
- supervises the work of technicians, technical specialists and other international and national staff required by the project when and if necessary;
- performs other duties as required.

CANDIDATES WILL BE ASSESSED AGAINST THE FOLLOWING

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in aquaculture, fisheries or related field.
- Seven years of relevant experience in technical cooperation related activities, policy advice and analysis relating to food and nutrition security, aquaculture, monitoring and evaluation of policies and programmes, hatchery management.
- Working knowledge of English and limited knowledge of another official language (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian or Spanish)

- Work experience in more than one location or area of work, particularly in field positions is desirable.

- Extent and relevance of experience in working with intergovernmental bodies and multidisciplinary teams.
- Extent and relevance of experience in mariculture project development and management.
- Knowledge of biological, technical, economic and financial aspects of milkfish, crab and sea cucumber culture.
- Extent and relevance of experience in working in Aquaculture business and hatchery management.
- Extent and relevance of experience in management and implementing large multicomponent donor-funded projects aimed at enhancing food, nutrition and income security, as well as projects geared towards linking smallholders to markets and rural finance.
- Extent and relevance in working and developing aquaculture projects (private and public sectors, and international cooperation projects), in the context of sub-Saharan Africa or in Africa.
- Demonstrated experience with target species (milkfish, mud crab, sea cucumber) will be an added advantage.
- Knowledge of Kiswahili is desirable.
